# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The Karate event of the 22<sup>nd</sup> National Sports Festival was held at the Civic Centre of the Obafemi Awolowo Square, Ikenne, Ogun State from the 21<sup>st</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> of May, 2025.

There was a total of **233 entries** from **28 states**. With the Onsite registration, only **193 competitors** were accredited from **26 States**, One (1) Athletes were disqualified from one states (Ogun State for Under-Age offence).

The twenty- six (26) states that participated in the 22<sup>nd</sup> National Sports Festival include: *Abia, Akwa Ibom, Anambra, Bauchi, Bayelsa, Borno, Cross Rivers, Delta, Edo, Ekiti, FCT, Gombe, Imo, Jigawa, Kaduna, Katsina, Kwara, Lagos, Nasarawa, Niger, Ogun, Ondo, Osun, Oyo, Rivers and Sokoto states.* The two states whose athletes did not show up for accreditation include Kano and Zamfara states.

08 competed in the Team Kata;

From the total of **238 matches** that took place, medalists emerged from **14 states out of the 26 states** that featured competitors. Out of the Six Geo-Political Regions in Nigeria, only four had at least one medalist. (Except the North East and North West Region), showing relatively, the growing popularity, spread and strength of Karate-do across Nigeria.

The National Sports Commission (NSC), had requested to the Federation to invite the National and Local Technical officials. States were advised to come with **Qualified Accompany Referees** to meet up the short fall for Technical Officials.

A Technical/ Coaches Certification Course was held to put the latest World Karate Federation competition rules on the burner for a strict enforcement at the National Sports Festival. Furthermore, the latest ICT Software Technology in combination with the WKF Event Management System was deployed at the event to assist the officiating. With emphasis on Video Review.

The Coaches Association brought a Protest on an Underage player from Ogun State, against the eligibility to participate in the Senior Category championship. Subsequently, Ayodele Rahmot was disqualified from participation. Her registration as an athletes in the Federation's Senior Championships falls prey to the WKF Rules and regulations.

#### INTRODUCTION

The Game of Karate was one of the featured sports at the 22<sup>nd</sup> Edition of the National Sports Festival held at Civic Centre of the Obafemi Awolowo Square, Ikenne, Ogun State from the 21<sup>st</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> of May, 2025. This presentation includes a detailed report of the Karate event, which was organized by the Karate Federation of Nigeria (KFN).

#### **KFN EVENT OBJECTIVES**

The objectives of the program were as follows:

- 1. To organize a Karate event that is closely aligned with World Karate Federation international standards.
- 2. To organize an event that is fair and seen to be fair to all participants.
- 3. To screen and further shortlist promising talents with enhance Ranking to the National Camp in preparation for the 2025 UFAK African Karaate Championship to be held in Abuja , July, 2025.

## **RECORD BREAKING ATHLETES**

#### CHALLENGES

1. **No provision for Karate Electronic System:** There were no budgetary plans for the provision of critical Karate ICT/Electronic officiating equipment and personnel. The Federation resorted to self-help.

2. Insufficient number of Invited Officiating Referees: Technical officials allocated for Karate were usually note enough. This caused a huge strain on the referees on Conflict of Interest.

### CONCLUSION

The Karate event at the 22<sup>nd</sup> National Sports Festival was successfully completed without hitches. According to most participants, it was fair, transparent, organized and timely. The event achieved its purpose of providing a platform for exposing our Karate players to a high-level competitive experience and in the process discover the most promising amongst them.

### RECOMMENDATIONS

**Increase Number of Invited Referees:** The NSF is an ideal tournament to further develop and grooming of our National Referees. Inadequate officiating officials had been the bane in the NSF. Increasing the number of officiating officials would help to ameliorate this and simultaneously allows much rotation that keeps the referees sharp and agile.

This low number of Referees had always put so much strain on the organizing and meeting the standards stipulated. Karate Technical Officials include: the Referee/JUDGES, the ICT experts/Personnel and the Technical/Organising
